Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Dispose of via a licensed waste disposal contractor.

Precautions for safe handling

Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see Section 8). Wash thoroughly after handling.

Conditions for safe storage

Store in accordance with local regulations. Store in original container protected from direct sunlight in a dry, cool and well-ventilated area, away from incompatible materials (see section 10) and food and drink. Keep container tightly closed and sealed until ready for use. Store and use only in equipment/containers designed for use with this product. Containers that have been opened must be carefully resealed and kept upright to prevent leakage. Do not store in unlabelled containers. Use appropriate containment to avoid environmental contamination.

Recommended monitoring procedures

Hand protection

Wear suitable gloves. Because specific work environments and material handling practices vary, safety procedures should be developed for each intended application. Skin protection
