## Section 7. Handling and storage

### Precautions for safe handling

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## Section 8. Exposure controls/personal protection

### **Recommended monitoring procedures**

##### **Hand protection**

Wear protective gloves if prolonged or repeated contact is likely. Wear chemical resistant gloves. Recommended: Nitrile gloves. Most gloves provide only a short time of protection before they must be discarded and replaced. ##### **Skin protection**
